

A reclusive Boston widow sends her alluring daughter, Aoife O'Malley, to the Santa Fe office of veteran art-crime detective Tom McNaul. The job: to recover a Monet water lilies painting that was stolen from their family twenty years ago in a murder/burglary in Northern Ireland. Tom accepts the challenge but soon finds himself pursued by lethal elements of Boston's Irish mob.

Outgunned and stymied by the murder of his only suspect, Tom joins forces with his older brother, Willie, and agent Kate Bacon, his former partner on the FBI Art Crime Team. When the three fly to Ireland, hoping to trace the painting from the original crime scene, they are swept into a world of violent political intrigue.

Their whirlwind circuit of the Emerald Isle soon turns deadly as agents of unknown organizations pursue them. Tom fears that radical elements of both the IRA and Orange paramilitaries want the painting to finance terrorism—


The Dark Side of Grace


Words Kill

A casual remark sparked by the actions of a vicious bully. A cold and sudden murder in response. And a trail of events and relationships linking and shredding lives in the tumultuous world of San Francisco's '60s-era racial and social awakening.

Decades later, the path to success seems clear for young attorney Cody Blaze, until a manuscript found after his father's death opens the window to a tragic past and thrusts the still-burning embers of another time's radical violence into the political reality of the present. What Cody sees when he opens the book are his father's fateful words: On October 16, 1968, I uttered a sentence that would haunt me for the rest of my life. The sentence was, "Someone should kill that motherfucker."

As he delves further and further into the memoir, history that once seemed far away becomes a deeply personal immersion for Cody into the storied heyday of the Haight: drugs, sex, war protesters, right-wing militias, groundbreaking journalism—and the


mysterious Gloria, who wanders into his father's pad one day to just "crash here for a while until things calm down."
